UWTT 2022 highlights in our 4 Priority Areas

Education Impact Area: Increasing the number of children reading to learn by age 8

- 5,500 children in 19 primary schools provided with resources to navigate the challenges of return to in person school
- 250 teachers and principals benefitted from activities to improve the schools for the New Norm of which 30 teachers received direct training support

In the Infants classes (5 to 6 years old)

- 393 children using the NOW! Language
 Development Programme with teacher training
 and mentorship by Morris Centre
- 596 children started social and emotional skills building using the Global Think Equal Programme
- 8 Classroom Assistant Trainees supporting teachers and children adapt to the New Norm
- 275 parents attended Confident Parenting Workshops provided by Families in Action

Family Wellbeing: Improving family resilience

 1,600 persons in 307 households benefitted from the UWTT family cash grant programme to help with recovery

Equity: Reducing inequalities

- 447,000 people accessed our digital content advocating for safe return to school and managing flood risks
- 35 grant awards benefitting 300 persons disbursed to support Children's Community Residences and other NGOs in their community work
