Youth Opportunity (Education)

Our Building Bridges from Learning to Success Programme seeks to support: Childcare and early childhood education, inschool, after-school and out-of-school time learning (homework center and pan in schools), school leadership and infrastructure improvement as well as literacy development.

Beneficiaries 2019-2024:

6,000 Students, Over 300 Teachers, 21 Schools



Community Resilience (Disaster Resilience)



UWTTs Community Fund Grant Programme supports NGOs and Children's Community Residences throughout Trinidad and Tobago, helping these NGOs to continue filling gaps of vulnerability in society and ensuring children's education, health, and emotional needs are met.

Beneficiaries 2024:

11 Children Residences- approx. 200 children and caregivers 7 Non Profit/Community Based Organizations- approx. 16,000 beneficiaries

Financial Stability (Family Wellbeing)

UWTT Family Cash Grant Programme was started as part of the Covid-19 Response and Recovery Programme in April 2020. The ultimate goal is to support Families identified to be most in need – by working with NGO partners and Building Bridges School Communities.

Beneficiaries 2024:

45 Grants Disbursed to Parents in 9 School Communities



Healthier Communities (Equity)



The Building Stronger Families Programme, done in partnership with Families in Action (FIA), have made an indelible contribution to the wellbeing of parents and by extension the families of the supported schools under the Building Bridges Programme.

Beneficiaries 2024:

54 workshops across 9 schools supporting close to 200 parents



UWTTs Homework and Learning Support Centre was implemented as a pilot project in Belmont Boys RC Primary School at the beginning of the 2024/25 academic year seeing close to 50 students being supported. This part of the Building Bridges Programme aims to help improve academic performance, address learning gaps, provide social-emotional support, strengthen parental involvement, and reinforce classroom learning. At the beginning of 2025, La Horquetta South Government Primary will also be joining the pilot, hoping to expand the other BBP schools.
